p. 156 "Bateas (*) are hollowed out of a single block of ~~solid~~ wood; the usual kind are generally two feet long and one foot wide. When they have been filled with ore, especially when but little is dug from the shafts and tunnels, men either carry them out on their shoulders, or bear them away hung from their necks."

(*) Alveus - "Tray". The Spanish name has been so generally adopted into the mining vocabulary for a wooden bowl for these purposes, that we introduce it here.
