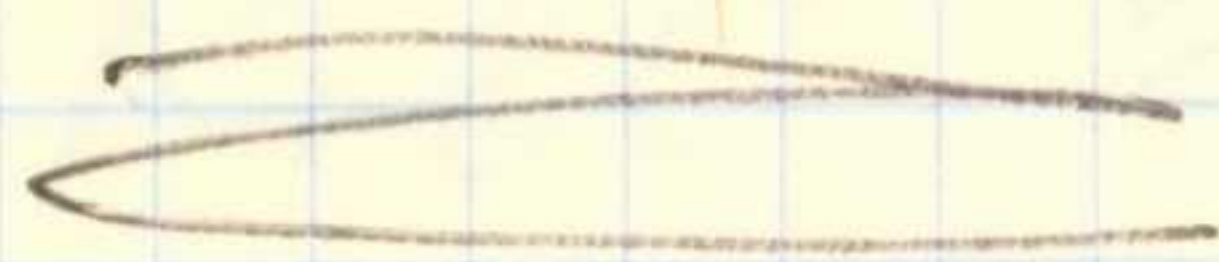

at Bahia, dated 30.I.1856, which stated

E. Smith of New Orleans with over 370
African negroes on board, that the vessel,
